Charter of Principles

As a Social Enterprise, the Peace Café offers its facilities for Values and Eco Training from non-profit organizations who provide ideas based on universally accepted principles and practice according to the various United Nations charters. The Peace Café is dedicated to the service of the community to foster inner values, environmental awareness and greater spiritual awareness. Participants are able to rediscover their original and intrinsic positive qualities in an atmosphere of respectful sharing.

The Charter of the Peace Café.

1. Courses and activities are offered on an individual basis or in a group setting for people of any background, nationality or religion. The organization is financed by voluntary donations from students and benefactors.
2. The courses offered at the Peace Café are not a substitute for any kind of health treatment. In that respect that the various teachers are not to intervene in, interfere with or alter any medical or therapeutic treatment, nor give any advice in this regard unless professionally and legally trained and authorised to do so.
4. The Peace Cafe and its representatives will at all times respect the confidential nature of all personal information shared by individuals, including information regarding their medical and psychological condition, and not pass on such information to any third party without the consent of the individual concerned.
5. Participation in Peace Cafe activities, whether on a casual or regular basis, does not discharge participants from their family, social, professional, civic or other responsibilities.
6. Students are welcome, at their own discretion, to participate in ongoing activities offered at the Peace Café at whatever level they feel comfortable. At all times they remain free of any obligation to continue with these practices, whether in whole or in part.
7. The Peace Café may refuse access to, or terminate the permission to participate, of any person whose attitude or behaviour disturbs public order or is detrimental to the ethics, reputation or activities of the Peace Cafe.
8. The Peace Cafe reserves the right to stop, interrupt or restrict the level of participation in its activities of any individual if the teacher or management believes this to be detrimental to that person's mental, emotional or physical health and well being.
9. Individuals are free to stop, interrupt or limit the level of their participation in the activities of the Peace Cafe.

10. Children or young adults under the age of 18 who would like to attend a course or activity will only be admitted in the presence of their parents or legal guardian or with the proper written authorization. The Peace Café has in place a Duty of Care Policy and a Child Protection Policy.

11. All lectures, retreats, courses, seminars, workshops and other activities of the Peace Café will clearly state any fees expected from participants or whether the program is offered free of charge as a community service. Participants are welcome to make voluntary monetary contributions via the donation box provided for this purpose, for day to day running expenses. Appropriate donations in kind are also welcome.

12. All Peace Café staff are paid or have volunteered and are not to accept any contribution of their time and services without the permission of the management.

13. Participation in any activities of the Peace Cafe or entry to its premises shall constitute full acceptance of these principles which may only be amended or varied in writing.
